In 1 Corinthians 15:20-28, Paul considers some benefits of our Savior's resurrection, namely the defeat of death and His being raised to life as the first fruits of the resurrection of His people. Here we see the Christ as the conqueror of our enemy's death and sin. Operating under the sovereignty of God, death is our foe. It is even God's foe as well, for He is the Lord of life. By our sin in Adam, we granted the right for death to claim us as part of the divine curse. By His righteous life, Christ destroyed any claim that death had over Him and those who are united to Him. Death threw its worst at our Lord, killing Him, but our Father was working in all that, using death as His instrument to pour out His wrath on our sin and raising Christ to life to prove that this wrath had been satisfied. By defeating the power of death, Jesus rendered it powerless over His people.

Thus, Jesus is the first fruits of those who have fallen asleep; (v. 20). Jesus was raised from the dead for our justification, yes, but He was also raised for our own resurrection. In other words, because Christ was raised from the dead, we will be raised as well. One day, our physical bodies will be resurrected, and we will be glorified, just as Jesus was. We have been united to Christ, having died to sin, and that union means that we are also united to Him in the resurrection (Romans 6:5). Our bodies will not remain in the grave forever. At the last day, our spirits will be reunited with them to live forever in the new heavens and earth.

We must never downplay the glory and importance of our Lord's resurrection. Not only does it provide for His vindication, but it is also the foundation for our own resurrection and victory over death. We do look forward to being in the presence of God at our deaths, but our final hope is the resurrection in which our spirits will be reunited with perfected bodies and when we will forever experience the glorified state that the Lord intended for us from the very beginning.

RHONDA JOHNSON - GLOBAL FINGERPRINTS

R and R, sisters sharing similar dimples and tawny curls, attended Vacation Bible school when the GlobalFingerprints ministry was launched in northern Brazil in April of 2023. They were ively and engaged in all the activities, from worship to Bible lessons, crafts to snacks. Yet, when the staff took us on a tour of the neighborhood, we came face to face with the reality of their lives.



Like 40% of the people in this part of Brazil, these girls live in extreme poverty. The home's floor was dirt, the neighborhood plagued with drug trafficking and gangs. Yet, they were blessed to have a home constructed of unfinished concrete block in an area prone to regular flooding. In spite of these hardships, they beamed to welcome visitors to their neighborhood.

Global poverty statistics echo this reality around the world. Approximately 333 million children are iving in extreme poverty, surviving on less than \$2.15 per day. Children make up more than half of the global poor, despite constituting only 31% of the total global population.
