



Pastor's Pen

From time to time, I watch or listen to podcasts where the participants are discussing the history and philosophy of politicians in the federal government. It doesn't take long for anger and disgust to build within me, and sometimes, when I discover the philosophy and behavior of a politician that I respected is less than stellar, disappointment enters my being. When disappointment hits, I ask myself, "Why do my unfulfilled expectations about this individual create disappointment within me? What is my disappointment saying about me?"

There is nothing new under the sun with disappointment. All of us have been disappointed. The question before all of us is this; how do I as a Christian handle disappointment?

Disappointment often reveals what your heart is really worshiping (Matt. 6:21; Luke 6:43-47). It exposes you. When you deal with disappointment, it's too easy to focus on the circumstances around you and cast blame on others rather than looking at the battle in your own heart. Think for a moment about the last time you were disappointed (Prov. 13:12). Was the bulk of your thinking and energy focused on the wrong done, the unhelpful circumstances, or your own heart? The natural tendency of sin is to blame others and not to deal honestly with our own heart. (Matt. 7:3-5).

Here is where you need to turn to Christ for help. You can start with a few simple words: "Help me, Jesus! I can't deal with this on my own. I need You." Where you turn with your disappointment is key. Handling disappointment on your own will only lead to more disappointment and more frustration and more disillusionment and even despair. Run to the cross (2 Cor. 5:15-21)! Let Christ comfort you and offer a kind of satisfaction that can only be found in Him. In the shadow of the cross, your disappointment is confronted and handled.

Life does not go as we expect, because sin corrupts everything in our world and leaves us sad, confused, regretful, and disenchanted. If you naively expect things to go well and downplay the power of the sinful flesh, you're not being realistic about sin. You are likely to be disappointed. But if you demonstrate "sober judgment" (Rom. 12:3)—a humble perspective on yourself, a realistic view of your sin—you're less prone to be disappointed. Our lives run into the real world, with real problems, real frustrations, and real heartache, and we acknowledge what we knew all along—sin ruins everything (Rom. 3:23). The Spirit is working powerfully within you, but your flesh is doing everything it can to undermine your life (Gal. 5:16-18).

As we live on this side of glory, sin will make a mess of things. Unfortunately, when things go wrong, our vantage point can be narrowed to the tiny kingdom of ourselves, and we can't see beyond our disappointment. We get fixated on the horizontal (anger, pain, confusion, disappointment) and lose sight of the vertical—our relationship with God. But God says: "My child, look up and see! It's not always going to be this way. One day, sin and pain will be no more." When you're disappointed, look up! Look beyond the confines of your circumstances and remember heaven (Ps. 73:24-26). Don't lose sight of eternity. In heaven, there will be no more disappointment because you'll get to be with God.

So, if you are disappointed with the government, or disappointed with something or someone else in your life, remember to go to Christ. Let Him handle your disappointment. He is God.

Having negative attitudes may not seem like a big deal, but we don't realize the effects your negative attitude has not only on you but the people around you. People are not usually drawn to a person who has a negative attitude. Negative only screams - stay away.

So how do we fix our negative attitude?

Change your focus. Focus on the right thing which is God. When we focus on God, we are not as likely to focus on the problem. A positive attitude is a result of focusing on God.

When challenges come, which they will, God wants us to acknowledge that He is far greater than our circumstance. We need to maintain a positive attitude because it is one of the most powerful ways we can show Christ living in us. Proverbs 23:7, "For as he thinks in his heart, so is he."

We have the choice of what kind of attitude we are going to have towards the situations in our lives. We can increase our joy by keeping our eyes on God instead of the "giants" in our lives. When we do this, things take on a whole new perspective and we can enjoy our lives while we positively trust Him to take care of our circumstances.

Putting God in control allows Him to take our problems and work them out for our good and leave us with a testimony of His power and goodness. You will not only find joy in life but you will be a blessing to those around you.
